## <u>January</u>

January 16, 2024 – IAF announces <u>former ICO Deputy Commissioner Steve Wood joins the IAF</u> as Senior Strategist.

January 18, IAF chat, **Topic focus on international frameworks and data transfers.**The EU Commission <u>announced</u> its adequacy report for 11 third countries and territories, <u>Report on the first review of the functioning of the adequacy decisions adopted pursuant to article 25(6) of <u>Directive 95/46/EC</u>. A must read by Ken Propp and Chris Docksey, argues that National security agencies should turn their commitment to accountability in handling personal data into an international legal framework: <u>An International Path Forward on National Security Access to Personal Data</u> was published in cooperation with Brookings.</u>

January 25, 2024, IAF Policy and Strategy Call – **California pre-draft ADMT and Risk Assessment regulations**, discussed during the <u>Dec 8 and January 12 CPPA Board Meetings</u>, are on everyone's radar, educate our members on the key sections of the draft, highlight the most challenging provisions, and take feedback on *how the IAF should* prioritize top concerns and suggestions for public comment. Innovative, data-driven companies—IAF member companies—cannot afford to ignore this draft regulation out of California

## **February**

February 1, 2024, Policy and Strategy Call - **Feedback session on GDPR Review comments**. The IAF took feedback on the topic details we will address in response to the GDPR Review (February 8 deadline). The EU Commission consultation document was issued on 11 January 2024.

February 7, 2024, Publication – <u>IAF Submission to GDPR Review February 8, 2024.</u>

February 8, 2024, chat, **Topic focus summary of IAF substantive comments to the <u>EU GDPR</u> Review.** 

- 1. acknowledged the impact the GDPR has made on corporate governance and privacy programs,
- 2. championed the need to improve the definition and application of privacy preserving technologies to enable compliant research,
- 3. framed the need for a refreshed approach to legitimate interests and risk assessments in a world of Al
- 4. emphasized the opportunity for a balanced and global view of international data transfers, and

5. suggested refinements to the approach of DPAs to GDPR implementation

February 13, 2024, Elizabeth Denham CBE is witness for Canadian government hearings on Bill C27.

February 22, 2024, chat topic, What are the boundaries between fair monitoring of employees, algorithmic assessments of employee productivity, and Al-based decisions? What are the expectations for transparency, proportionality and the role individual rights in the employment context. Prompted by over 600 complaints, last week the <a href="CNIL fined an Amazon Logistics">CNIL fined an Amazon Logistics</a> for intrusive surveillance, disproportionate collection, inadequate data security and notification.

February 26, 2024, Blog by Elizabeth Denham and Steve Wood, <u>IAF Submission to the European Commission's GDPR Review Report – More to be Done to Unlock Responsible and Accountable Innovation</u>

February 27, 2024, **Digital Regulation in the UK, hosted by Baker McKenzie.** An event focusing on cross regulatory approaches to Al and the public law issues that arise. The first panel was chaired by IAF Chief Strategist Elizabeth Denham CBE, designed to provide substantive conversations between regulators, government, commercial leaders, and advisors on the challenges surrounding Al in digital regulation and cross regulatory approaches to Al.
